



New Racks for Optis and Prams

WSA was very fortunate to receive a Take It Outside Grant to replace the existing wooden racks along the breakwall. The new racks will occupy the same footprint but are much more efficient and attractive. There will also be a rack to store the empty dollies which will keep them away from the ramp and save valuable space in the lot. The new racks will arrive in the spring.

Thundermist Sold – search underway for a smaller replacement

The Thundermist's engine suffered a fatal breakdown in August and the decision was made to sell the boat and replace it with a smaller boat more appropriate for working with Beginners.

Additional Optis needed next year

The WSA population has been growing and growing up. The Beginners of recent years are moving into Optis in increasing numbers and WSA will need to add at least two boats for next summer. WSA may sell a few Prams to make room for the Optis.

Staffing Challenges continue

Unfortunately, Rodrigo Benvenuto will not be able to return as Head Instructor next year. He did a terrific job last summer and he will be missed. Several candidates are currently in the interview stage and a new head instructor will hopefully be hired before Christmas. Some of last year's staff will be returning but WSA is seeking 2 Opti Instructors and a 420 instructor. Domestic applicants continue to be very hard to find. It is likely that we will have one or more instructors from overseas that will need accommodations.


We bid goodbye to treasuredWickford Yacht Club members, our friends Willa, Michael, Don & Pam, Joan, and Al.
